The Five Stages of NADWA (Nurturing Artistic Development with Worldly Awareness) outline a structured approach to fostering student development in artistic and wellness activities. Here's a detailed description of each stage

1. Planning the Schedule

In this initial stage, the program coordinators take a strategic approach to designing the weekly schedule. This involves:

- Identifying Objectives: Setting clear goals for what the program aims to achieve each week.
- Activity Selection: Choosing a diverse range of activities that cater to various artistic and wellness interests, ensuring inclusivity and broad participation.
- Resource Allocation: Ensuring all necessary materials, spaces, and mentors are available for

the planned activities.

- Scheduling:Creating a balanced timetable that fits within the overall schedule, avoiding conflicts and ensuring optimal participation.
 - 2. Practice According to the Scheduled Program

Once the schedule is set, students begin their preparation phase. This stage involves:

- Assessment Criteria: Using clear, predefined criteria to ensure fairness and consistency in evaluations, focusing on both technical skills and creative expression.
- Identifying Strengths and Areas for Improvement: Highlighting what each student did well and

where they can improve, ensuring feedback is balanced and constructive.

5. Feedback

The final stage is dedicated to delivering and acting on the evaluations. This stage focuses on:
